Montreal is a multicultural city with a large student population thanks to its four universities, Concordia, McGill, Université de Montréal, and UQAM, the site of the 2017 ATypl meeting. Check out some of Montréal's unique offerings during your stay.

MUSEA

The city's main museum is **The Montreal Museum of Fine Arts** (or Musée Beaux-Arts Montréal). This spacious museum showcases Quebec and Canadian visual works, and international contemporary art. It is free for people under 30 years of age. There is a great permanent exhibition, as well as interesting short-term special exhibitions. Throughout September, one can enjoy psychedelic art at the Revolution Exhibition at the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts. And for fashionistas, a Jean-Paul Gaultier haute couture exhibition will take place in the same museum.

Smaller musea include the **Contemporary Art Museum of Montreal**, which is part of the Place des Arts complex, just two blocks south of UQAM, and **Musée McCord Museum**, a public research and teaching museum dedicated to the preservation, study, diffusion, and appreciation of Canadian history, from hockey to Inuit art, and the **Canadian Centre for Architecture**, which features international exhibits on architecture and urban planning in a historic mansion and sculpture garden.

LIBRARIES

The **BAnQ Grande Bibliothèque** (Bibliothèque et Archives nationales du Québec) serves as Québec's national library. Its decor is stunning, and its spaces quiet and inviting.

On McGill University's campus, type aficionados will be delighted by its Rare Books and Special Collections (10am-6pm) in the **McLennan Library Building**. In particular, the Colgate History of Printing Collection was established by William Colgate, an art historian, in the 1950s. This collection is noted for its extensive holdings on the history and technique of printing; calligraphy and letter forms; design of typefaces and typographical productions; type founding and type founders' specimens and printers' manuals and handbooks, including those for colour printing and paper making.

CLASSICAL AND AVANT-GARDE DANCE

Most dance, classical and modern ballet events take place at **Place des Arts**. During the ATypl week, there are dance or ballet performances on September 12 (Encounter: Montreal / Barcelona), September 13 (Diversity), September 14 (Women's outlook), September 15 (Montréal eclectique), and September 16 (Montréal with family).

For acrobatic dance, grab a taxi and head to the suburb of Laval, a 30-minute drive north, for daily performances of Montreal's own Cirque du Soleil. This year's show, called Ovo, takes place every day from 13 until 17 September, at **Place Bell** in Laval.
